1. Bid reserved for Make In India products: : Procurement under this bid is reserved for purchase from Class 1 local supplier as defined in public procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017 as amended from time to time and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Nodal Ministry for specific Goods/Products. However, eligible micro and small enterprises will be allowed to participate. The minimum local content to qualify as a class 1 local supplier is denoted in the bid document. All bidders must upload a certificate from the OEM regarding the percentage of the local content and the details of locations at which the local value addition is made along with their bid, failing which the bid is liable to be rejected. In case the bid value is more than Rs 10 Crore, the declaration relating to percentage of local content shall be certified by the statutory auditor or cost auditor, if the OEM is a company and by a practicing cost accountant or a chartered accountant for OEMs other than companies as per the Public Procurement (preference to Make-in -India) order 2017 dated 04.06.2020 . In case Buyer has selected Purchase preference to Micro and Small Enterprises clause in the bid, the same will get precedence over this clause.

2. Purchase preference to Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs): Purchase preference will be given to MSEs as defined in Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 dated 23.03.2012 issued by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Ministry. If the bidder wants to avail the Purchase preference, the bidder must be the manufacturer of the offered product in case of bid for supply of goods. Traders are excluded from the purview of Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises. In respect of bid for Services, the bidder must be the Service provider of the offered Service. Relevant documentary evidence in this regard shall be uploaded along with the bid in respect of the offered product or service. If L-1 is not an MSE and MSE Seller (s) has/have quoted price within L-1+ 15% (Selected by Buyer)of margin of purchase preference /price band defined in relevant policy, such Seller shall be given opportunity to match L-1 price and contract will be awarded for 25% (selected by Buyer) percentage of total QUANTITY.

# **Buyer Added Bid Specific Additional Terms and Conditions**

- 1. Scope of supply (Bid price to include all cost components) : Only supply of Goods
- 2. Bidder's offer is liable to be rejected if they don't upload any of the certificates / documents sought in the Bid document, ATC and Corrigendum if any.
- 3. Supplier shall ensure that the Invoice is raised in the name of Consignee with GSTIN of Consignee only.
- 4. OPTION CLAUSE: The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 25 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. The purchaser also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity by up to 25% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at the contracted rates. Bidders are bound to accept the orders accordingly.
- 5. Bidder shall submit the following documents along with their bid for Vendor Code Creation:
  - a. Copy of PAN Card.
  - b. Copy of GSTIN.
  - c. Copy of Cancelled Cheque.
  - d. Copy of EFT Mandate duly certified by Bank.

- 2. Appearance: Clear, light greenish colored liquid.

2. Suppliers/manufacturers, who has to provide certificate (with each lot delivered) from NABL-accredited laboratory that the quality parameters conform to the requirements of NSF/ANSI 60 standard (including heavy metal content in the chemical)

-Sodium Chlorite Percentage, pH & Specific gravity will be tested at NTPC Gadarwara lab for which the vendor may send his representative to witness.

-Vendor to give procedure for testing sodium chlorite concentration and MSDS along with the technical bid.

-The analysis report at NTPC/Gadarwara laboratory will be full and final.

-Any parameter deviation will lead to the rejection of the material and it is the liability of the vendor to return back the material at their own risk and cost.

-Material to be supplied to NTPC Gadarwara on door delivery basis by vendor in SS (stainless steel) road tanker by vendor's own arrangement, risk & cost. All compliance of environmental/ safety/motor vehicle transportation regulations etc need to be followed and its vendor's responsibility.

-Staggered delivery as and when required basis on intimation from NTPC Gadarwara. The first lot of Approx. 10-20 MT is to be supplied within 15-20 days of receipt of the PO. For balance quantity, each lots of 10-20 MT to be delivered within 5-10 days of intimation from NTPC Gadarwara. Total delivery to be completed within one year of the PO date.

-The supply period may be extended for further 3-6 months on mutual consent from NTPC and Vendor with same terms and conditions.

-The supply truck shall be equipped with all safety devices. The party shall ensure the verification of the following viz. valid certificate for vehicle to transport the hazardous chemical, endorsement of valid driving license of the truck driver carrying hazardous chemicals, availability of TREM card for the material to be transported, availability of personal protective equipment.

-All driver/concerned staff should be well aware about material safety data sheet (MSDS) of the hazardous chemicals they are carrying and it must be implemented whenever applicable.

- Weighment Tolerance: Weight recorded at NTPC end shall be final & binding. However a tolerance of +/- 0.5% on supplier's invoiced quantity shall be allowed, i.e. if the weight of Sodium chlorite as per technical specification basis recorded at NTPC end is within +/-0.5% of the invoiced quantity, then payment shall be released as per Vendor's invoiced quantity; otherwise payment shall be released as per NTPC measured quantity. However, maximum quantity to be considered for payment shall be invoiced quantity.

- The Vehicle carrying material must report before 12.00 noon of any working day. Vehicle reporting after 12.00 noon may be unloaded on next working day without any demurrage.

(2) **Qualifying Requirement:** The bidders who wish to participate in the bidding shall satisfactorily establish that they fulfil the following Qualifying Requirements.

#### 1.0 Technical Criteria

1.1 The Bidder should be a Manufacturer OR an Authorized Supplier of the manufacturer of Sodium Chlorite.

1.2 The Bidder should have executed contract for supply of Sodium Chlorite as per the following within the preceding seven (7) years reckoned as on the date of Techno-commercial bid opening:

Executed value not less than 640MT of Sodium Chlorite in a Single Contract.

OR

Executed value not less than 400MT of Sodium Chlorite in Two Contracts each.

OR

Executed value not less than 320MT of Sodium Chlorite in Three Contracts each.

Notes: Notes for clause 1.1 above

The word "executed" means the bidder should have achieved the criterion specified in the Qualifying Requirements, even if the total contract is not completed/ closed. In case contract(s) is under execution as on the date of techno-commercial bid opening, the value of work executed till such date will be considered provided the same is certified by the employer.

#### 2.0 Financial Criteria

2.1 The average annual turnover of the Bidder, in the preceding three (3) financial years as on the date of Techno-Commercial bid opening, shall not be less than Rs. 684.00 Lakhs (Rupees Six Hundred and Eighty Four Lakhs only).

2.2 In case the bidder is not able to furnish its audited financial statements on standalone entity basis, the unaudited unconsolidated financial statements of the bidder can be considered acceptable provided the bidder furnishes the following further documents on substantiation of its qualification:

- Copies of the unaudited unconsolidated financial statements of the bidder along with copies of the audited consolidated financial statements of the Holding Company.

- A certificate from the CEO/CFO of the Holding Company as per the format enclosed in the bid documents stating that the unaudited unconsolidated financial statement from part of the consolidated annual report of the company.

2.3 In case where audited results for the last financial year as on the date of Techno Commercial Bid Opening are not available, the finance results certified by a practicing Chartered Accountant shall be considered acceptable. In case, Bidder is not able to submit the Certificate from practicing Chartered Accountant certifying its financial parameters, the audited results of three consecutive financial years preceding the last financial year shall be considered for evaluating the financial parameters. Further, a certificate would be required from the CEO/CFO as per the format enclosed in the bidding documents stating that the financial results of the Company are under audit as on the date of Techno-Commercial Bid Opening and the Certificate from the practicing Chartered Accountant certifying the financial parameters is not available.

Notes: (i) Other income shall not be considered for arriving at annual turnover.

(3) Qualification: Bidders are required to furnish the details of the past experience like authentic Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements, client certificates, completion certificate, etc. in support of meeting the Qualifying Requirements based on which selection is to be made. These references shall only be considered to ascertain the bidder's compliance to Qualifying Requirement (QR). No claims without supporting documents shall be accepted in this regard. However, if any of the Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements pertains to the work executed by Bidder for NTPC in the past, then in respect of such Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements, Bidder shall not be required to enclose Client Certificate along with its Bid.

Bidders wishing to provide additional Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements are required to be uploaded with bid. However, bidders are not permitted to quote more than the three times the number of Works/Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreement asked for in the Qualifying Requirements (QR).

Bidders shall certify their confirmation to the following conditions:

(a) The number of reference Works/Orders quoted by Bidder in the bid, for establishing compliance to the specified Qualifying Requirement (QR), are in accordance with the provision specified BID.

(b) The reference Works/Orders/declared Orders, shall only be considered for evaluation/establishing compliance to Qualifying Requirement (QR). Any reference Orders declared more than as specified in bidding documents shall not be considered for evaluation/establishing compliance to Qualifying requirements.

(c) No change or substitution in respect of reference Orders for meeting the specified Qualifying Requirement (QR) shall be offered by the bidder.

EMPLOYER/BUYER will determine to its satisfaction whether the participating bidders are qualified to satisfactorily perform the contract in terms of the qualifying requirements stipulated in the Bidding Documents. It will be based upon an examination of documentary evidence of bidder's qualification submitted by the bidder along with Techno-Commercial Bid as well as such other information as EMPLOYER/BUYER deems necessary and appropriate.

Notwithstanding anything stated anywhere else in the bidding documents, EMPLOYER/BUYER reserves the right to seek in writing information relating to qualifying requirements in addition to details contained in the bid. The bidder shall furnish required information promptly to EMPLOYER/BUYER. EMPLOYER/BUYER will shortlist the Bidders meeting the stipulated Qualifying Requirements.

During the bid evaluation the EMPLOYER/BUYER may, at its discretion, ask the Bidder for a clarification of its bid including documentary evidence pertaining to only the Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements declared in the bid for the purpose of meeting Qualifying Requirement specified in Bidding Documents. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in the price or substance of the bid including substitution of reference Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements in the bid by new/additional Work Orders/Purchase Orders/Letter of Awards/Contract Agreements for conforming to Qualifying Requirement shall be sought, offered or permitted.

NTPC reserves the right to verify any claims made by vendors and to carry out a capability assessment. The decision of NTPC shall be final in this regard.

Notwithstanding any stated above, NTPC reserves the right to undertake a physical assessment of the capacity and capabilities including financial capacity and capability of the Bidder to perform the Contract, should the circumstances warrant such as assessment in the overall interest of NTPC.

Bids not meeting the requirements as stated in the Bidding Documents shall be rejected.

An affirmative determination of meeting the qualifying requirements will be a prerequisite for further evaluation of Techno-Commercial bid. A negative determination will result in rejection of the Bidder's Techno-Commercial Bid in which event EMPLOYER/BUYER will not open the Price Bid of the concerned bidder.

A negative determination may result in the rejection of the Bid.

# Disclaimer

The additional terms and conditions have been incorporated by the Buyer after approval of the Competent Authority in Buyer Organization. Buyer organization is solely responsible for the impact of these clauses on the bidding process, its outcome and consequences thereof including any eccentricity / restriction arising in the bidding process due to these ATCs and due to modification of technical specification and / or terms and conditions governing the bid. Any clause incorporated by the Buyer such as demanding Tender Sample, incorporating any clause against the MSME policy and Preference to make in India Policy, mandating any Brand names or Foreign Certification, changing the default time period for Acceptance of material or payment timeline governed by OM of Department of Expenditure shall be null and void and would not be considered part of bid. Further any reference of conditions published on any external site or reference to external documents / clauses shall also be null and void. If any seller has any objection / grievance against these additional clauses or otherwise on any aspect of this bid, they can raise their representation against the same by using the Representation window provided in the bid details field in Seller dashboard after logging in as a seller within 4 days of bid publication on GeM. Buyer is duty bound to reply to all such representations and would not be allowed to open bids if he fails to reply to such representations.

This Bid is also governed by the General Terms and Conditions

In terms of GeM GTC clause 26 regarding Restrictions on procurement from a bidder of a country which shares a land border with India, any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Competent Authority. While participating in bid, Bidder has to undertake compliance of this and any false declaration and non-compliance of this would be a ground for immediate termination of the contract and further legal action in accordance with the laws.
